A rule question:

In a game, What happens if you hit a field kubb out of bounds when you are tossing newly aquired field kubbs? For example, let's say that my opponent has placed a field kubb (due to my having tossing it foul twice) near the outside boundary of the game field. My next turn, it is still there, and now when I toss my kubbs that my opponent struck down, I hit that kubb and it (or both) travel out of the playing field. I presume I would get my second toss with the kubb I threw, but what about the field kubb that was struck and travelled out of bounds?

When returning knocked down field kubbs, if you hit one that is already standing from previous turns, just put it back where it was. But you can always play your own 'house' rules, as long as you all agree. Here at KubbUK, we'd rather have an amicable game. As an example, at the 2009 UK tournament, 2 children playing 2 adults knocked over the King [having knocked over all the field Kubbs] but weren't standing at the baseline - the adults charitably let the children rethrow from the baseline rather than [as they were strictly speaking allowed to do] claim the game.
